

Year 3- Snow Day learning at home

Choose some tasks to do while you enjoy your day in the snow

Outside tasks:

- Make a snowman that you think is exactly 1 metre tall. When you think you've done it, how could you measure it to check? If it isn't a metre, can you work out how many centimetres too short or tall it is? With a help from your grown up, to make sure you use the internet safely, can you take a photo of your metre high snowman and email or tweet it to school?
- How many snowballs can you make in a minute? When you've made your snow balls, can you put them in groups of 2? 3? 4? Or 5? If you can't, can you explain why not?

Inside tasks (If you get too chilly)

- Imagine Miss Papacosta is stuck at school. She is snowed in. The snow is piled high against the doors and she can't open them to get out! Can you write a set of instructions for how to rescue her? You'll need your time words, bossy verbs and warnings (and maybe a snow plough or team or husky dogs!)
- Bring some snow in from outside- make a big snowball and a small one. Which one do you think will melt first? Which one will make the biggest puddle? Observe them carefully Find out the answers and see if you can work out why?
- Snuggle up in a cosy spot and read a book
- Finally have lots of fun playing in the snow!
